

# Geography Bee – Final Round

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## Regulation Tossups

(1) **The historic Kotagede neighborhood in this city contains the remains of the first capital of the Mataram Sultanate. A greater metropolitan area centered around this city contains Magelang and Sleman, (+) the latter of which is home to Gadjah Mada University. Hamengkubuwono the Tenth serves as sultan of this only royal city in (\*) Indonesia. For the points, name this Indonesian city, the only other than Jakarta to be known as a "special region", which served as the country's capital during its war of independence.**

ANSWER: **Yogyakarta** (do NOT accept or prompt on "Jakarta")

(2) **The emblem of this place features a pair of crossed swords on top of a pair of crossed chains above the words "Sustain. Support. Defend." The expansion of this place was the subject of the 2005 Daechuri Protests. This site lies on the former site of Pyeongtaek Airfield, (+) which was built by Imperial Japan. This location is near the community of Anjeong-ri and is about 40 miles south of Seoul. (\*) For the points, name this most populous U.S. overseas military base, home to over 40,000 military and civilian personnel.**

ANSWER: Camp **Humphreys** (or United States Army Garrison-**Humphreys**; or **USAG-H**)

(3) **This peninsula's Cité de la Mer is home to the museum submarine Redoutable. This peninsula is mostly dominated by the Armorican Massif, and this peninsula forms the northern portion of the Manche department. This peninsula forms the eastern boundary of the Gulf of Saint-Malo, and (+) Cherbourg lies at the tip of this peninsula, whose eastern shoreline contains Utah Beach. (\*) For the points, name this Norman peninsula which juts into the English Channel and is located east of Guernsey and Jersey.**

ANSWER: **Cotentin** Peninsula (accept **Cherbourg** Peninsula before mentioned)

(4) **One tributary of this river originates from the extremely remote Jack London Lake. Along this river, Pleistocene Park attempts to re-create the Ice Age-era "mammoth steppe," south of Chersky. This river derives its name from the Tundra Yukaghir word for "river," and Dalstroy managed prison camps in this river's surrounding region. A highway crossing this river, which is nicknamed the (+) "Road of Bones," connects Yakutsk to Magadan. Emptying into the East Siberian Sea is, (\*) for the points, what remote river of far north-eastern Russia?**

ANSWER: **Kolyma** River

(5) Sites in this area include the Carter Baron Amphitheatre, the Joaquin Miller Cabin, and Pierce Mill, the last remaning gristmill on this area's main waterway. The discovery of the bones of intern Chandra Levy in this location led to popular misconceptions that (+) this place was unsafe. This place's southern end is bounded by the Cleveland Park and Columbia Heights Neighborhoods, as well as the National Zoo. (\*) For the points, name this urban park in the District of Columbia, centered around a namesake tributary of the Potomac River.

ANSWER: Rock Creek Park

(6) This city lies on an eponymous body of water called a *liman*, which receives the Devnya and Provadiyska rivers and is crossed by the Asparuhov Bridge. This city is a gateway to the resort community of Golden Sands, and its Sea Garden (+) is the largest landscaped park in the Balkans. *Demeter*, the ship of Dracula, was said to be docked in this city, which is located between Constanța and Burgas. (\*) For the points, name this second-largest port on the western Black Sea, the third-largest city of Bulgaria.

ANSWER: Varna

(7) The Wagenya people created a system of wooden tripods on this river to harvest fish. The cities of Ubundu and Kindu are situated along this river, which has its source in the Katanga Boot, and this river is fed by the Lukuga River, which drains Lake Tanganyika. Boyoma Falls, (+) also known as Stanley Falls, is situated along a curve of this river, and the port city of Kisangani is often considered the lowermost extent of this river. (\*) For the points, name this largest source tributary of the Congo River.

ANSWER: Lualaba River (prompt on "Congo River" before mentioned)

(8) The southwestern coast of this island is home to a unique Phoenician juniper forest surrounding the Korission Lagoon. Pilgrims on this island may walk from the town of Perithia to the top of its highest point, (+) Mount Pantokrator. This island is home to the Ionian University, the youngest of its country's colleges. This island lies off the shores of the Albanian town of Sarandë and rocky islets surrounding this island form the (\*) westernmost point of Greece. For the points, name this island that was once home to the Corinthian colony of Corcyra.

ANSWER: Corfu (accept Kerkyra or Corcyra before mentioned)

(9) This location's White Cyclone attraction was converted into *Hakugei* by Rocky Mountain Construction in 2019. This location's Shuttle Loop is one of only six remaining Schwarzkopf coasters, as well as the only one in Asia. Until the opening of Falcon's Flight in Saudi Arabia, (+) this park contained the longest rollercoaster in the world and the tallest in Asia, Steel Dragon 2000. (\*) For the points, name this amusement park in Mie Prefecture, which is partially named for the *onsen* hot springs and a nearby city.

ANSWER: Nagoshima Spa Land

(10) **This island is home to the largest U.S. Coast Guard base, as well as the Pacific Spaceport Complex. This island is home to Miller Point, where the World War Two-era Fort Abercrombie has been made into a state park. (+)** Several portions of this island were permanently raised over 30 feet in elevation following the 1964 Good Friday Earthquake. After Hawaii's Big Island, this is the (\*) second largest island in the United States. For the points, name this largest Alaskan island, which shares its name with a subspecies of large brown bear.

ANSWER: **Kodiak** Island (accept **Oikertaq**)

(11) **This mountain range contains the Soborom hot springs near the Tarso Voon stratovolcano. A caldera in this mountain range near Toussidé is the Trou au Natron. The tallest peak in this mountain range is located in the Borkou Region and contains the Era Kohor caldera, while (+)** *gueltas* are used to gather water by the indigenous people of this mountain range, the Toubou. (\*) For the points, name this mountain range in the Sahara which contains a peak named Emi Koussi and lies in northern Chad and southern Libya.

ANSWER: **Tibesti** Mountains (or **Tibesti** Massif)

(12) **This city's Monument to the Sun consists of photovoltaic glass plates which produce a light show at night. The islands of Ugljan and Pašman lie on an eponymous archipelago off the coast of this city, and a "Sea Organ" (+)** in this city produces sounds from waves underneath marble steps. This city, which is connected via ferry to Ancona across the Adriatic Sea, is its country's third-largest port city, behind (\*) Rijeka. For the points, name this city in the northernmost part of Dalmatia, the fifth-largest of Croatia.

ANSWER: **Zadar** (or **Zara**)

(13) **A city of this name boasts the original Baskin-Robbins and the headquarters of IHOP. That city of this name between Burbank and Pasadena houses St. Gregory the Illuminator Cathedral, the North American seat of the (+)** Armenian Catholic Church. Another city of this name contains the Westgate Entertainment District, which features the State Farm Stadium and the (\*) Desert Diamond Stadium, a venue formerly known as the Gila [[HEE-lah]] River Arena. For the points, give this name borne by a suburb of Phoenix that hosted Super Bowl 57 in 2023.

ANSWER: **Glendale**

(14) **This body of water provided the codename for the Nazi invasion of Denmark and Norway. This river's longest tributary is the Aller, and it bounds the Butjadingen Peninsula, which includes the port of Nordenham. This river is formed by the confluence between an eponymous tributary, which rises in Thuringia, and the Fulda river in Hannoversch Münden, and it empties into the (+)** Wadden Sea. This river, which forms part of the western border of Lower Saxony, also flows through Bremen. (\*) For the points, name this second-longest river entirely within Germany, whose mouth lies just west of the Elbe.

ANSWER: **Weser** [[VEH-zuh]] River (accept **Operation Weserübung**)

(15) **Two of the five examples of these locations in the world lie in the towns of Carpentaria in Santa Barbara County and McKittrick in the Central Valley. Another of these locations in Venezuela, which is called Lake Bermudez, was used by the Warao people to caulk canoes. (+)** Kerosene was first obtained from one these locations called Pitch Lake in Trinidad and Tobago, and Hancock Park contains one of these locations known for its (\*) mammoth fossils in Los Angeles. For the points, name these natural asphalt deposits, exemplified by one found in La Brea.

ANSWER: **tar pits** (accept La Brea **tar pits**; accept **asphalt pits** until "asphalt" is mentioned)

(16) **This national park contains Darwin Glacier, as well as Mount Goddard, which is on the boundary of the Evolution Basin. Sediment behind a terminal moraine led to the creation of this national park's Zumwalt Meadow. One of the entrances to this (+)** national park includes the Big Stump Grove, where the Mark Twain Stump can be found. (\*) For the points, name this national park in the Sierra Nevada mountain range which is located in Fresno and Tulare [[too-LEH-ree]] counties, north of Sequoia National Park.

ANSWER: **Kings Canyon** National Park (or **General Grant** National Park)

(17) **This feature in the Taoudeni Basin was likely formed by a subsurface igneous intrusion deforming overlying sedimentary rock around 100 million years ago. In aerial views, layers of salt on this feature's northern half typically appear blue. This location in the (+)** Adrar Plateau was initially thought to be an impact crater but was later determined to be a (\*) domed anticline. For the points, name this 25-mile-wide eroded geological structure in central Mauritania, whose concentric rings earned it the nickname "The Eye of the Sahara."

ANSWER: **Richat** Structure (or Guelb er **Richât**; accept **Eye of the Sahara** before mentioned)

(18) **This location was constructed as the summer residency of the viceroy of New Spain, and this specific location is referenced in the "Marines' Hymn" as the "Halls of (+)** Montezuma." Alongside the Palace of Iturbide, it served as one of its country's only royal palaces actually once inhabited by monarchs. This location currently serves as the site of the National Museum of History following its establishment by (\*) Lazaro Cardenas. For the points, name this location, the former residence of Mexican presidents prior to Los Pinos.

ANSWER: **Chapultepec** Castle (or Castillo de **Chapultepec**)

(19) **This city was settled by Moravian missionaries as New Herrnhut. United Airlines began flights to this city last year, which uses to airport code GOH. This city is situated on a (+)** fjord called Baal's River, and its Katuaq cultural center is known for its (\*) aurora borealis-inspired shape and is made of larch wood. The capital of Sermersooq, this city, which is also called Godthåb [[GAAT-haap]], is located on the Labrador Sea and is the world's northernmost capital of a constituent state. For the points, name this capital of Greenland.

ANSWER: **Nuuk** (accept **Godthåb** before mentioned)

(20) **This national park's ruins of City West were planned to be a rival to Chicago, and this national park is split between LaPorte, Porter, and Lake Counties. This national park, the only one in the continental U.S. to include a state in its name, (+)** is the most-visited national park in the Midwest. This national park's western section is situated in Gary, and its (\*) Hoosier Slide disappeared due to mining activity. For the points, name this national park on Lake Michigan, which is named for large sand formations.

ANSWER: **Indiana Dunes** National Park

(21) **This island's highest point is the active stratovolcano Ulawun. Following a 1994 volcanic eruption, the capital of this island's eastern state was moved from Rabaul to Kokopo while its largest city, Kimbe, (+)** serves as the capital of its western state. This largest island in the Bismarck Archipelago is separated from (\*) New Ireland by the St. George's Channel. For the points, name this island in Papua New Guinea, which is named after a European island.

ANSWER: **New Britain**

(22) **The Ayagoz River flows from the Tarbagatai Mountains into this body of water, where Korzhin Island is found. The closed city of Priozersk is located on the shores of this body of water, which contains Tasaral Island (+)** and is fed by the Lepsy and Karatal Rivers. The Ili River enters this body of water after flowing through the Xinjiang Uighur Autonomous Region. (\*) For the points, name this body of water, the largest lake entirely in Kazakhstan.

ANSWER: Lake **Balkhash** (or Lake **Balgash**; or **Balgas** koli)

(23) **This city was the first in the Southern Hemisphere to install electric street lights. The Wildebeest Kuil Rock Art Centre lies on the outskirts of this city, the former capital of (+)** Griqualand West. This city's "Big Hole" claims to be the world's deepest hand-dug hole, and the De Beers company defended this city during the Second Boer War. Cecil (\*) Rhodes made his fortune using resources from, for the points, what capital and largest city of South Africa's Northern Cape region, which was once a major diamond mining town?

ANSWER: **Kimberley** (accept **Kimberley** Mine)

(24) **This mountain range contains the largest population of the Homerus swallowtail, the largest butterfly species in the Western Hemisphere. One crop named for this mountain range is grown in towns such as Hagley Gap and is used to create a liqueur called Tia Maria. This mountain range's highest peak is split between Portland and Saint Thomas (+)** parishes, and it forms a national park with the John Crow Mountains. Including Maroon communities such as Scott's Hall, (\*) for the points, what highest mountain range in Jamaica is known for its eponymous coffee?

ANSWER: **Blue** Mountains

(25) **Two answers required. A creole language used in these two cities is known as *Língua da Casa*. These two cities are separated from each other by the Gulf of Khambhat, with one of them situated off the Kathiawar Peninsula (+) and the other lying south of Surat. Before they were merged with Dadra and Nagar Haveli, these two cities once formed the (\*) least populous union territory of mainland India. For the points, name these two former Portuguese colonies administered with Goa, which form part of a union territory on the coastline of Gujarat.**

ANSWER: **Daman and Diu** (accept Dadra and Nagar Haveli and **Daman and Diu**)

(26) **It's not part of Europe, but this city's island of Shamian was formerly split between French and British control. The Zhu River begins in this city, whose eastern fringes are marked by the Dong River, (+) and this city is located between Dongguan and Foshan. This city, which traditionally speaks Yue Chinese, (\*) is located northwest of Shenzhen and Hong Kong in the Pearl River Delta. For the points, name this capital city of Guangdong, whose historic name gave rise to the Cantonese dialect.**

ANSWER: **Guangzhou** (or **Kwangchow**; accept **Canton** before "Cantonese" is mentioned)

(27) **It's not an impact crater, but the Makhtesh Ramon is one of these features in the Negev Desert. The Great Gulf and the Tuckerman Ravine are two of these features in New Hampshire's White Mountains. Bout du Mond in Burgundy is a rarer fluvial version (+) of these features, which are often bound on their lower ends by till or moraines, and bound on their upper ends by headwalls. (\*) For the points, name these amphitheater-like valleys, which are typically formed by glacial erosion.**

ANSWER: **cirques** (or **corrie**; or **cwm**)

(28) **An underwater statue called *Christ of the Abyss* was made to protect scuba divers in this sea, which includes the resort towns of Sanremo and Portofino. This sea's eastern shoreline is home to a string of seaside villages known as the Cinque Terre, (+) and Livorno is a major port on this sea, whose southern boundary is formed by the island of Elba. The Arno River feeds, (\*) for the points, what sea which contains the Gulf of Genoa and forms the northwestern-most coastline of Italy?**

ANSWER: **Ligurian** Sea

(29) **This peak can be reached via the Reiss Couloir route, and a subpeak of this mountain called the Shar was first summited in 1970 by Rolf Walter and Sepp Mayerl. Climbing this mountain and another taller neighbor within 24 hours (+) is achieved in the "Double Crown." The South Col is located between this mountain and Mount (\*) Everest, and this mountain is also the namesake of a brand of ski goggles. For the points, name this nearly 28,000-foot mountain which has a name meaning "South Peak" in Tibetan and is the fourth-highest mountain on Earth, after Kangchenjunga.**

ANSWER: **Lhotse** (or **lho tse**; or **L'hotse**; accept **Lhotse** Main; accept **Lhotse** Shar)

(30) In this country, the Kombe people intermarried with the Benga people on the island of Corisco. A creole people in this country, known as the Fernandino people, are named after a Portuguese explorer who discovered its island of (+) Bioko. That island in this country is the indigenous homeland of the Bubi people, who are now a minority due to the migration of its largest ethnic group. The Fang people (\*) are concentrated in the Río Muni region of, for the points, what country, home to the port city of Bata?

ANSWER: Republic of Equatorial Guinea (or Republica de Guinea Ecuatorial; or République de Guinée équatoriale)

(31) The world's largest human-made excavation, the Bingham Canyon Mine, was dug out in order to mine this resource in Utah. The mining of this resource produced a spill on the Rio Sonora in 2014, which resulted in a fine targeted against Grupo México. This metal is used to make the (+) roofs of 40 Wall Street and the Woolworth Building, and the highest-elevation railway in the Americas (\*) is operated by a major producer of this metal, Antofagasta plc. For the points, name this metal, which is mined in the Atacama Desert.

ANSWER: copper (or Cu; or Element 29)

(32) Maria Guyomar de Pinha introduced desserts to this country influenced by Portuguese cuisine such as foi thong and sangkhaya. The promotion of this country's cuisine was a diplomatic tool under the "Kitchen of the World" campaign of former prime minister (+) Thaksin Shinawatra. In a 2011 poll, this country had the most number of dishes in the top 50, including recipes such as (\*) tom yung kung and som tam. For the points, name this Southeast Asian country known for curry variants such as "massaman" and "green."

ANSWER: Kingdom of Thailand (or Ratcha Anachak Thai; or Prathet Thai; accept Siam)

(33) This city's tallest buildings include the Trilogy Towers and the ONE, the tallest seafront residential building in Europe, while its City of Dreams Mediterranean is the largest integrated resort in the EU. This city lies north of the British military base of Akrotiri, and is built on (+) Amathus, a former cult center of Aphrodite, which was destroyed by Richard the Lionheart. (\*) For the points, name this city, which forms the second-largest urban area in Cyprus and lies in the country's extreme south.

ANSWER: Limassol (or Lemesos)

(34) This city is overlooked by the Hezar Masjed Mountains of the larger Kopet Dag range. This city's Imam Reza shrine is the world's largest mosque (+) by floor area, and this city also contains the tombs of Nader Shah and the poet Ferdowsi. This city's Koohsangi park formerly contained a sculpture in the shape of the Pahlavi Crown, and this city serves as the capital of (\*) Razavi Khorasan province. Located in the country's far northeast, for the points, what is the second-largest city of Iran by population?

ANSWER: Mashhad

(35) **This polity had its capital cities at Almaliq and Qarshi, and this polity corresponded roughly to the lands of the former Qara Khitai Empire. This polity persisted in a rump state called Moghulistan, which later split into the Yarkent Khanate and Turpan Khanate (+) after Transoxania was lost to the Timurids. This polity's boundaries were marked by the Amu Darya River and the (\*)** Altai Mountains. For the points, name this khanate south of the Golden Horde, a remnant of the Mongol Empire which occupied Central Asia.

ANSWER: **Chagatai** Khanate (or **Chagatai** Ulus; prompt on "Mongol Empire")

(36) **Italian immigrants into this state have mostly worked as grape farmers in its Serra Gaúcha region. São Leopoldo was the first city to be settled by German immigrants in this state, and they later established a presence at the Novo Hamburgo municipality. An admixture of Portuguese and (+) Amerindian-Spanish peoples in this state have shaped its Gaucho culture with nearby Argentina, Uruguay, and Paraguay. (\*)** For the points, name this southernmost state of Brazil, whose capital is at Porto Alegre.

ANSWER: **Rio Grande do Sul**

(37) **The Talagi Airport provides international travel to and from this city, which was the target of a 2004 bombing that killed 58 people. Richard Chancellor was invited to the court of Ivan the Terrible after landing at this city, and a certain being named (+) Michael is depicted on the coat of arms of this city, which the English stumbled upon after entering the (\*)** White Sea. For the points, name this northern Russian city, which is named for a type of biblical figure.

ANSWER: **Arkhangelsk** (or **Archangelsk**; or **Archangel**)

(38) **This city's Ohr-O'Keefe Museum of Art was designed by Frank Gehry. This city was possibly where the first Blessing of the Fleet ritual occurred, and an estate in this city called Beauvoir was once the home of Jefferson Davis. This city's Maritime and Seafood Industry Museum was destroyed in (+) 2005 by Hurricane Katrina, and this city, which is home to Keesler Air Force Base, lies next to (\*)** Gulfport. For the points, name this Gulf Coast city, the fourth-largest by population in Mississippi.

ANSWER: **Biloxi**

(39) **This company formerly held the naming rights to Melbourne's Docklands Stadium, which is now named for Marvel. This company lends its name to an under-construction soccer stadium in Queens, New York, as well as the stadium that hosts (+) Manchester City. This company has its largest office in Khalifa City, and the main hub of operations of this company is situated at Zayed (\*)** International Airport. For the points, name this flag carrier of the United Arab Emirates, an airline based in Abu Dhabi.

ANSWER: **Etihad** Airways

(40) **The Russky Bridge was built in advance of a meeting of this group in 2012. Summits of this group have been hosted in cities such Port Moresby in 2018, and it was hosted in the city of Gyeongju in 2025. Woodside's Filoli estate in San Mateo County hosted a meeting (+) between Joe Biden and Xi Jinping during a meeting of this group in 2023, where homeless encampments were cleared in San Francisco. (\*)** For the points, name this inter-governmental organization, a group of 21 countries, named for the world's largest ocean and continent.

ANSWER: **APEC** (or **Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation**)

(41) **This disaster prompted the most recent activation of emergency shelter use along Interstate Four after evacuation orders from Hillsborough County were issued. This disaster delayed the launch of the Europa Clipper, damaged the roof of (+) Tropicana Field, and prompted the closure of a Busch Gardens location. This hurricane was the second-most powerful in the Gulf of Mexico after Hurricane Rita and devastated the (\*) Tampa Bay area. For the points, identify this most powerful hurricane of the 2024 season.**

ANSWER: Hurricane **Milton**

(42) **This Afroasiatic language dominates the city of Kano, and, alongside Arabic, this language is an official language of the traditional Sokoto Sultanate. While French is the working language, this most-spoken Chadic language has been the official language of (+) Niger. In one country, this language is one of three major native languages alongside Yoruba and Igbo. (\*)** For the points, name this most-spoken indigenous language of Nigeria, whose namesake ethnic group lives alongside the Fulani.

ANSWER: **Hausa** (or Halshen **Hausa**; or Harshen **Hausa**)

(43) **Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, this location served as the venue of Mike Pence's 2020 RNC vice-presidential nomination acceptance speech. A statue called *Orpheus with the Awkward Foot* overlooks this site at the southeastern end of its city's Locust Point neighborhood. The most famous event at this site, which overlooks the (+) Patapsco River, is commemorated every September 12th by Defenders Day. (\*)** For the points, name this former military installation in Baltimore, whose 1814 defense was the subject of a poem by Francis Scott Key.

ANSWER: Fort **McHenry** (or Fort **McHenry** National Monument and Historic Shrine; accept "Defence of Fort **M'Henry**")

(44) **It's not part of Brazil, but this region grants a namesake award at the Oscar Niemeyer International Cultural Centre in the city of Avilés. This region was also the site of the Battle of Covadonga, which ended the expansion of (+) Al-Andalus. This region's largest cities include Oviedo and Gijón, and this region is sandwiched between the Cantabrian Mountains and the (\*) Bay of Biscay. For the points, name this region of northwestern Iberia, which traditionally names the presumptive heir to the Spanish throne.**

ANSWER: Principality of **Asturias** (or **Asturies**; accept Prince or Princess of **Asturias**; prompt on "Spain" or "Iberia" before mentioned)

(45) **This island hosts eight national parks, including the Lore Lindu National Park and the Bogani Nani Wartabone National Park, which includes endemic species such as the Anoa. Smaller island chains located near, and administered by, this island include the Selayar Islands (+) and the Talaud Islands. This island contains four peninsulas, (\*) including its South Peninsula, which is home to the Bugis people. For the points, name this eleventh-largest island in the world, which is separated from Borneo by the Strait of Makassar.**

ANSWER: **Sulawesi** (or **Celebes**)

### Extra Questions

(1) **This country's construction of a lighthouse on Märket caused its border to shift slightly westward. The summit of this country's highest point, Halti, (+) was planned to be transferred to it in 2017 to celebrate its independence, although that plan was canceled. This country contains the world's largest archipelago by number of islands in the Archipelago Sea, and a territory of this country uses a flag with a red cross on top of a (\*) yellow cross on top of a blue field. For the points, name this country home to the Åland Islands.**

ANSWER: Republic of **Finland** (or **Suomi**; or **Suomen** tasavalta; or Republiken **Finland**)

(2) **This country's Firestone hydroelectric power station was built on the Farmington River and supplies power to Robertsville near the town of Harbel. The Saint John River flows through this country's Grand Bassa County, which has Buchanan (+) as its capital. This country's capital was founded at Cape Mesurado by African American settlers and is named for the fifth (\*) president of the United States. For the points, name this West African country which has English as its official language and is governed from Monrovia.**

ANSWER: Republic of **Liberia**

(3) **Extinct species named after this province were discovered within its Horseshoe Canyon Formation. This province is known as the largest rat-free populated area in the world, and it contains the city of Drumheller in the Red Deer (+) River Valley, which is known for its display of dinosaur bones. This province is home to the Head-Smashed-In Buffalo Jump, (\*) as well as the largest national park of mainland North America, Wood Buffalo National Park. For the points, name this province where grizzly bears can be seen in Banff National Park.**
