

2025-2026 Regional Tournament Study Guide – Red Question Set

Instructions: This study guide should be your first step in preparing for the National Geography Bee Regional Tournaments on the Red Question Set. Many of the facts below are found in the 120 questions on the Red Question Set. Other facts in the study guide will be found in the other Question Sets being used this academic year. However, the majority of questions in the tournament are not referenced in the study guide. The study guide is meant to help you get started. It is not meant to be fully comprehensive as the essence of academic competition is not memorizing a list, but having wide-ranging knowledge.

As the questions are all short paragraphs on a particular topic, if a topic is found below, then it is a good idea to learn more about it (since additional facts about a topic will also be referenced in the question). It is also helpful to read the introduction of a Wikipedia page on a topic. Please also use the National and Regional Capitals Study Guides and our past question sets which are <u>found here</u>. Many of the topics that are found in past years' questions will come up this year too. Good luck!

Note: This academic year, the study guides are slightly shorter than in past years, but we are also including a list of additional terms at the end. These are also likely to be referenced at some point in the tournament, but you will need to do some research to learn about the significance of each of these.

African Geography

- 1. Egypt's two major cities of Cairo and Alexandria are both located on the Nile River, the world's longest.
- 2. Ethiopia is a landlocked country in East Africa. It is the most populous landlocked country and its capital is Addis Ababa.

Asian Geography

- 1. Mandarin and Cantonese are Chinese languages. Mandarin is the world's most spoken first language.
- 2. Japan is home to four main islands, the largest of which is Honshu, which includes cities such as Tokyo and Hiroshima.
- 3. According to Islamic tradition, the prophet Muhammad was born in Mecca, Saudi Arabia.
- 4. Amman is the capital of Jordan, a Middle Eastern country which shares the Dead Sea with Israel.
- 5. <u>India</u> is a large South Asian country home to the cities of <u>Mumbai</u> and <u>New Delhi</u>. In 2023, it passed <u>China</u> to become the world's most populous country.
- 6. Hong Kong is a Special Administrative Region of China, that reverted to Chinese control from the United Kingdom in 1997.

Australia & Oceania Geography

- 1. Brisbane is the largest city in the Australian state of Queensland.
- 2. <u>Antarctica</u> is the world's southernmost continent, is classified completely as a <u>desert</u>, and is the only continent with no permanent human residents.
- 3. Some of the unique animals found in the wild only in Australia are the duckbill platypus, kangaroo and koala.

European Geography

- 1. Iceland, whose capital Reykjavik is the world's northernmost, is the only Nordic country not to lie on the European mainland.
- 2. The world's largest lake by area is the Caspian Sea, which receives inflow from the Ural and Volga rivers.
- 3. Munich, the capital of the German state of Bavaria, hosts Oktoberfest, one of the world's largest festivals.
- 4. Russia, the world's largest country in area, is governed from its capital, Moscow.
- 5. Vatican City, a microstate within Rome, is the world's smallest nation in area and the headquarters of the Roman Catholic Church.
- 6. Monaco, a small city-state on the French Riviera.
- 7. The <u>flag of the United Kingdom</u> is displayed on the flags of other <u>Commonwealth</u> countries such as <u>Australia</u>.

U.S. & Canadian Geography

- 1. The U.S. state of <u>Texas</u> contains a <u>panhandle</u> in its north that is home to the city of <u>Amarillo</u>.
- 2. Nashville is the capital of Tennessee. It is known as "Music City" and is the home of the Grand Ole Oprv.
- 3. The <u>Space Needle</u> is an iconic <u>Seattle</u> landmark.
- 4. Ontario is the most populous province in Canada, with its capital at Toronto, Canada's largest city.
- 5. <u>Dover</u> (the capital) and <u>Wilmington</u> (the largest city) are among the major population centers of <u>Delaware</u>.
- 6. Lake Michigan is the only Great Lake to be located completely in the USA. Chicago and Milwaukee are located on its shores.
- 7. Arizona takes its state nickname from the Grand Canyon, which was formed by the Colorado River.
- 8. Rivers of the U.S. state of Georgia include the Savannah and the Chattahoochee.
- 9. Wyoming is the least-populous US state.

Latin American and Caribbean Geography

- 1. <u>Uruguay</u> is a South American country located between <u>Argentina</u> and <u>Brazil</u> that forms the northern coast of the <u>Rio de la Plata</u>.
- 2. The Amazon River is the longest river in the Americas. It rises in Peru and flows across a namesake rainforest.
- 3. Mexico is home to the cities of Guadalajara and Cancun, and has a flag displaying an eagle eating a snake on a cactus.
- 4. Within the Caribbean, the Virgin Islands is an archipelago shared by the US and the United Kingdom.
